





**ADVISORY ON VACCINATION-DIFFERENTIATED SAFE
MANAGEMENT MEASURES (SMMs)**

1. The vaccination-differentiated SMMs for vaccinated individuals have been implemented since 10 August 2021 for participation in higher-risk activities and for entry to large-scale events.
2. Vaccination-differentiated SMMs enable higher risk activities and large-scale events to resume in a safe manner as we progressively open our economy and community. We have eased measures for those who are fully vaccinated because they have good protection against the infection and are at lower risk of becoming dangerously ill if infected with COVID-19. On the other hand, unvaccinated individuals will need to be more prudent in interacting with larger groups of people especially in mask-off settings, which are higher risk. Hence stricter measures are applied for them.

Eligibility for Vaccination-differentiated SMMs

3. **An individual is considered to be “vaccinated” and eligible for vaccination-differentiated SMMs if he or she meet any of the following criteria:**
 - a. Fully vaccinated, i.e. has received the appropriate regimen of World Health Organisation Emergency Use Listing (WHO EUL) vaccines (e.g. Pfizer-BioNTech/Comirnaty, Moderna, AstraZeneca-SKBio, Serum Institute of India, Janssen, Sinopharm, Sinovac-CoronaVac) including their respective duration post-vaccination for the vaccine to be fully effective (refer to summary in **Annex A**), and had their vaccination records ingested in MOH’s national IT systems; or
 - b. Recovered from COVID-19, i.e. less than 270 days of first positive Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test result obtained in Singapore; or
 - c. Has a negative result on a pre-event test (PET) by an [MOH-approved COVID-19 Test Provider](#) in the past 24 hours, covering the duration of the stipulated activity. For example:



4. Children who are 12 years old and below, who are unvaccinated, are eligible for vaccination-differentiated SMMs and may be included in a group of up to 5 persons for higher-risk activities and large-scale events. If there is more than one such child in the group, all children must be from the same household. For large-scale events, the total number of children is capped at 20% of the actual event size. 5. Individuals who do not fall into the above categories are required to undergo a pre-event test by MOH-approved COVID-19 test providers and obtain a negative PCR or ART result. Results from self-administered ART supervised by employer and self-administered ART that are unsupervised are not recognised for vaccination-differentiated SMMs. Refer to <https://go.gov.sg/swabproviders> for the list of MOH-approved COVID-19 test providers.
6. Individuals who deliberately misrepresented themselves and/or others (e.g. including but not limited to the provision of false or misleading verification documents and/or information) may be subject to enforcement action under the Penal Code, Infectious Diseases Act and/or other COVID-19 legislation.

Implementing Vaccination-differentiated SMMs checks

8. Businesses which are required to implement vaccination-differentiated SMMs, please refer to **Annex C** for processes to be implemented by businesses introducing vaccination-differentiated SMMs. **The use of the SafeEntry (Business) App is strongly encouraged to facilitate eligibility checks for both TraceTogether App and Token users. Approved Vaccines

Individuals may be considered as fully vaccinated if they meet the conditions in the table below.

S/N	Name of Vaccination	Number of Doses	Minimum Interval between doses	Interval from Completion of Vaccine Course to Fully Vaccinated
1	Tozinameran (Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine or Comirnaty COVID-19 vaccine)	2 doses	17 days	14 days
2	Moderna COVID-19 vaccine	2 doses	24 days	14 days
3	Vaxzevria (AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine)	2 doses	24 days	14 days
4	Covishield COVID-19 Vaccine (Serum Institute of India)	2 doses		14 days
5	Johnson & Johnson's (J&J) Janssen COVID-19 vaccine	1 dose	NA	14 days
6	Sinopharm COVID-19 vaccine	2 doses	17 days	14 days
7	Sinovac- Coronavac COVID-19 vaccine	2 doses	13 days	14 days

Unvaccinated individuals who were infected with COVID-19 infection will need to take a single dose of any vaccine listed in the table above after a minimum of 28 days from diagnosis of COVID-19 infection. They will be considered fully vaccinated 14 days after the single dose.

Please refer to the First Schedule of the Infectious Diseases (Mass Gathering Testing for Coronavirus Disease 2019 Regulations 2021) for the most updated information on the vaccination regimen and approved vaccines recognised for VDS eligibility.

² SC/PR/LTPHs who are vaccinated overseas must first be tested serology positive at a medical provider before their vaccination records are recognised by MOH. SE (Business) App and TT App will only be able to display their vaccination status after the clinic has provided the data to National Immunisation Registry (NIR). ³ Beyond 30 days, STPH will be required to undergo a serology test in order for the vaccination status to continue to be recognised and shown as “Vaccinated” on SE (Business) App and TT Apps. 
⁵ Negative results obtained from self-administered ART test and self-administered ART test performed under supervision by parties other than MOH-approved COVID-19 test providers are not eligible for vaccination-differentiated SMMs. Individuals with negative ART results obtained from Quick Test Centres (QTCs) are eligible for vaccination-differentiated SMMs if the negative result was taken in the last 24 hours and covers the duration of the event, business or activity.

Processes to be Implemented by Business Implementing Vaccination-differentiated SMMs

1. Businesses that implement vaccination-differentiated SMMs should put up clear signages to inform individuals on this and verify their eligibility status, in addition to implementing TraceTogether-only SafeEntry (TT-only SE). They are encouraged to inform individuals of the documents they will need to provide ahead of their visit where possible.
2. Businesses must verify that the individual fulfils the eligibility requirements before allowing him/her to enjoy vaccination-differentiated SMMs.
3. Checks by businesses should be limited to the verification of the individual's eligibility status for vaccination-differentiated SMMs, and data should not be used for other purposes or be stored.

Using SafeEntry (Business) App

4. Businesses that have deployed the SafeEntry (Business) App and SafeEntry Gateway (SEGW) function to facilitate check-ins should ensure that the app has been updated to the latest version. The vaccination-differentiated SMMs check-ins

should be enabled for the venue via the SafeEntry (Business) dashboard, before they are able to verify vaccination status and test result⁷.

- Businesses can verify the individual's vaccination status or test status, including the duration of test validity, by requesting individuals to tap their TraceTogether App or Token against the businesses' SafeEntry (Business) App.
- The SafeEntry (Business) App check-in process also provides the last four alphanumeric characters of the person's NRIC/FIN which can help authenticate the identity of the individual checking-in to the event or activity. The eligibility criteria, illustrated using the SafeEntry (Business) App icons, can be found in Diagram 2 below.

- If the individual meets criteria for vaccination-differentiated SMMs, tap on "Yes" to complete the SafeEntry check-in. If the individual does not meet criteria for vaccination-differentiated SMMs, tap on "No" and deny the individual from entering.
- If the above method is not available, the business may use a camera/2D scanner linked to the SafeEntry (Business) app to scan the TraceTogether Token's QR code. In extenuating circumstances, NRIC/FIN can also be scanned at the discretion of the business. Individuals should be reminded to replace Tokens that are faulty or out of battery.

Using other modes for eligibility checks

9. Businesses may ask individuals to show their vaccination status or test status on their TraceTogether or HealthHub App. Businesses should ensure that the individual is not displaying a screenshot by requesting individuals to click on other icons or “refresh” button within the app.

11. Businesses must not recognise any other documents, copies, or any other variations in format and should verify that acceptable documents provided for entry (e.g. physical test result notices, PET Exemption Memo, etc.) belongs to the individual, i.e. NRIC/FIN on the document matches the NRIC/FIN on the government-issued photo identification card. Hardcopy overseas vaccination certificates will not be accepted for vaccination-differentiated SMMs.
