## Implant Categories that will be Covered in the Implant Subsidy List

On 1 December 2023, implants that have been assessed for 15 out of 26 implant categories will transit to the Implant Subsidy List. The remaining categories are currently being assessed and will progressively transit to the Implant Subsidy List in the next few years. When an implant category transits to the Implant Subsidy List, it means that the implants within that category that are clinically- and cost-effective will be listed on the Implant Subsidy List. Conversely, implants within the category that are not clinically- and cost-effective will not be listed on the Implant Subsidy List.
