Changes to Align Border Measures with Domestic Protocols and Evolving Pandemic Conditions in Other Countries/ Regions

Review of Countries/ Regions Categories

Based on the COVID-19 situation in Cambodia, Egypt, Hungary, Indonesia, Israel, Malaysia, Maldives, Qatar, Rwanda, Samoa, South Africa, Tonga, the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and Vietnam, they will be placed in Category II from 11 November 2021, 2359 hours.

2. Based on the COVID-19 situation in Argentina, Bangladesh, Belarus, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ethiopia, India, Kuwait, Laos, Mexico, Myanmar, Nepal, Oman, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, the Philippines, Romania, Russia, Serbia, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Ukraine, they will be placed in Category III from 11 November 2021, 2359 hours.

Changes in Testing Regime

- 3. We had previously announced that only Reverse Transcriptase Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) tests are recognised as valid PDTs. From **11 November 2021**, **2359 hours**, we will also recognise a negative professionally administered² Antigen Rapid Test (ART) result as a valid PDT for all travellers arriving in or transiting through Singapore from Category II/III countries/ regions (including travellers via the Vaccinated Travel Lane (VTL))³. For avoidance of doubt, such travellers will still be allowed to present a negative PCR test result as valid PDTs. All PDTs must continue to fulfil the following requirements:
 - a. Taken within 2 days⁴ prior to departure for Singapore;
 - b. Test result memo must state:
 - i. Negative test result in English;
 - ii. Date that the test was taken:
 - iii. Traveller/s name; and
 - iv. Either Date of Birth or Passport Number as stated in the passport.
- 4. The full set of prevailing border measures for different categories and changes to border measures will be updated on the <u>SafeTravel website</u>. Travellers are advised to visit the website to check the latest border measures for their country/ region, and be prepared to be subjected to the prevailing border measures upon entry into Singapore.
