

Open Clusters

Epidemiological investigations and contact tracing have uncovered links between cases.

- i. 3 of the confirmed cases (Cases 60102, 60389 and 60439) are linked to the Case 60102 cluster, with the most recent case (Case 60439) linked to the cluster on 23 February. Case 60102 is a 41 year-old female Singaporean who works as a cabin crew with Singapore Airlines and was confirmed to have COVID-19 infection on 8 February. Case 60389 is her spouse, and Case 60439 is her domestic helper.

As a precautionary measure, persons who had been at these locations during the specified

timings should monitor their health closely for 14 days from their date of visit. They should see a doctor promptly if they develop symptoms of acute respiratory infection (such as cough, sore throat and runny nose), as well as fever and loss of taste or smell, and inform the doctor of their exposure history.

Individuals may access the SafeEntry Location Matching Self-Check service via the TraceTogether App, SingPass Mobile, or at <https://wereyouthere.safeentry.gov.sg> to check whether they were at these locations during the specified timings, based on their own SafeEntry records.

There is no need to avoid places where confirmed cases of COVID-19 have been. The National Environment Agency will engage the management of affected premises to provide guidance on cleaning and disinfection.
