

**Measures for In-Person Visits to Hospitals and Residential Care Homes  
from 1 September 2022**

	<b>Hospitals</b>	<b>Homes</b>
<b>Number of visitors</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 2 visitors per patient at the bedside each time</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 2 visitors per resident allowed per visit</li></ul>
<b>Visit duration</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Visitors to abide by the hospital's visiting hours</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Each visit will be capped at 1 hour</li></ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Visitors are encouraged to self-test ART negative on the day of the visit. Visitors should not visit their loved ones if they are feeling unwell.</li><li>• All visitors entering the hospital wards or Homes must don face masks with good filtration capability at all times. These include surgical masks and reusable masks that are made of two layers of fabric. Visitors are reminded not to eat or drink in the hospital wards or residential areas of the Homes, or use the toilets designated for patients/residents in the wards/Homes. They should also avoid sitting on patients'/residents' beds.</li><li>• Hospitals and Homes have the discretion to impose additional visitor limits and/or testing requirements for visitors of vulnerable or unvaccinated patients/residents, and suspend visits if they have active COVID-19 cluster(s) to reduce transmission.</li></ul>
